**Radio:** The game will be broadcast live on the Rutgers Radio Network, WOR 710 AM in New York City and WCTC 1450 AM in New Brunswick. Bruce Johnson will serve as play-by-play announcer and Dick Lloyd will provide commentary. WRSU 88.7 FM will also broadcast the game.

Rutgers, under the leadership of second-year head coach Fred Hill, plays consecutive road games for the first time this season when it travels to the Prudential Center in Newark Thursday evening to meet NJIT in a 7:00 p.m. tip-off. A 29-mile drive separates the RAC from the "Rock." The contest marks the first meeting between the Scarlet Knights and Highlanders on the hardwood. NJIT is in its second season reclassifying to Division I.

Rutgers (6-3) is coming off a 63-51 loss at Big 12-member Nebraska Sunday afternoon. It was a five-point game with just over 10 minutes remaining, but the Huskers went on a 14-4 run to secure the win and remain undefeated at home. Freshman guard Corey Chandler scored 25 points to pace RU, the most points posted by a true freshman since Quincy Douby scored 28 in 76-71 NIT win over Temple in 2004. Sophomore center Hamady Ndiaye issued five blocks and junior forward JR Inman contributed 12 points in the loss.

Ndiaye leads the BIG EAST and ranks seventh nationally in blocks with 3.8 rejections per game. His total of 34 blocks is fifth-best among all Division I players. Inman ranks among the top 10 in the BIG EAST in scoring (t-5th, 17.1), rebounding (10th, 8.7), defensive rebounds (8th, 6.75) and minutes played (8th, 35.44). He also places 62nd nationally in rebounding.

As a team, the Scarlet Knights are among the nation's best in blocked shots and personal fouls. Rutgers ranks 20th in the country with six blocks per game and 16th nationally with just 15 fouls per contest.

Thursday evening's game will serve as a homecoming for Chandler, who was rated as the nation's 10th-best guard prospect at nearby East Side High School. Junior guard Courtney Nelson, who has been sidelined recently with an injury, also calls Newark home and was named the state's player of the year at Bloomfield Technical High School.

NJIT (0-12) suffered a 62-53 set back at Stony Brook this past Monday evening. Junior forward Nesho Milosevic scored 15 points and grabbed 13 rebounds for the Highlanders. Milosevic leads the team in both scoring (11.3) and rebounding (8.3) this season.

**QUICK SHOTS**

- The Scarlet Knights are 12-7 all-time in games played on December 13. The last time Rutgers played on the date, it defeated Princeton 51-49 in 2003. The Scarlet Knights have won the last four games they have played on Dec. 13.
- RU next hits the hardwood versus consensus No. 1 North Carolina at the RAC Sunday evening. Bill Raftery and Sean McDonough will call the action live on ESPN. The Scarlet Knights have never beaten a No. 1-ranked team. The highest-ranked opponent defeated was a 61-53 won over then No. 4 UConn at the RAC on Jan. 30, 2002. RU beat four ranked teams in 2001-02.
- Rutgers' 6-0 home start is its best since 2005-06. That season, the Scarlet Knights won their first seven home contests en route to a 19-14 record and an NIT berth. RU has a 325-139 record all-time at the RAC.
- With six returning lettermen on the squad, the Scarlet Knights are tied for the fewest number of veterans in the BIG EAST. Four of the six returning players have at least one full season of starting experience, with three competing as starters for at least two years.
- The BIG EAST will feature an 18-game conference schedule after playing a 16-game slate for the last eight seasons. The 18-game format will have teams play each opponent once and three opponents twice. Rutgers will play Louisville, Seton Hall and South Florida twice in 2007-08.

- NJIT and Rutgers have two common opponents, Lafayette and Rider. The Scarlet Knights defeated Lafayette 90-79 at the RAC on Dec. 05; NJIT fell to the Leopards 81-56 at the Kirby Sports Center in Easton, Pa. on Dec. 3. Rider comes to the RAC to take on the Scarlet Knights on Dec. 21, while NJIT fell to the Broncs 84-58 on the road on Nov. 28.
- NJIT head coach Jim Casciano began coaching as a volunteer assistant at Villanova. Rutgers head coach **Fred Hill** was an assistant at Villanova for four years before coming to Piscataway.
- NJIT's 15-player roster features eight New Jersey natives. Other states represented are Michigan (1), Georgia (1), North Carolina (1), New York (1), and Pennsylvania (1). The Highlanders also have two international players in junior forward Nesho Milosevich (Montenegro) and freshman forward Paulius Skema (Lithuania).

- Two of NJIT's assistant coaches worked in the vicinity of Rutgers. **Wendell Alexis** spent a year coaching as an assistant at St. Joseph High School in Metuchen, N.J., and **David Grande** is president of Vitusa Products, Inc. of Berkeley Heights, N.J.

### ROSARIO, MORRIS & JACKSON SIGN WITH RUTGERS

Rutgers announced Nov. 14 that **Mike Rosario** (Jersey City, N.J./St. Anthony's), **Christian Morris** (Bronx, N.Y./South Kent School) and **Patrick Jackson** (Brooklyn, N.Y./Boys & Girls) signed National Letters of Intent to compete for the Scarlet Knights. All three signees are rated among the top 25 prospects at their respective positions nationally, including Rosario, who was cited as the country's 18th overall player by ESPN.

"We are very excited about this year's recruiting class," said Hill. "To sign three young men of this caliber out of strong, national programs in the region, goes directly to our philosophy of bringing in the best student-athletes in New Jersey, New York and Philadelphia to build the Rutgers program. We are extremely pleased to welcome them into the Rutgers basketball family.

"Our three signees definitely bring a lot to the table. They all bring something different, but are all high-energy players that have an opportunity to have an impact in our program right away."

The three recruits all hail from the Metro area and will arrive "On The Banks" after competing at some of the nation's most successful and storied programs. St. Anthony's has captured two national championships (1989, 1996), 24 state championships, and nine Tournament of Champions titles under head coach Bob Hurley, Sr. South Kent (Conn.), under the leadership of Raphael Chillious, is ranked No. 6 nationally in the Scout.com 2007-08 preseason prep poll and has produced current NBA players Andray Blatche and Dorell Wright. Boys and Girls, under the direction of Ruth Lovelace, advanced to the PSAL Class AA Championship last year and produced legendary players Lenny Wilkens, Connie Hawkins and Pearl Washington.

"It is significant to bring in players that are extremely well-coached and that have competed against top competition in big games," said Hill. "Young men that play at an elevated level in high school or prep school gain valuable experience that enables them to be more prepared for the BIG EAST."

### INMAN RECOGNIZED AMONG BIG EAST LEADERS

The BIG EAST Conference named junior forward **JR Inman** to its initial Honor Roll of the 2007-08 men's basketball season on Monday, Nov. 19. Inman averaged 20.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game in the first four contests to help lead the Scarlet Knights to a 3-1 record. Through the first nine games, Inman has paced the team in scoring six times and in rebounding on seven occasions. He ranks 62nd nationally in rebounding and is among the top 10 in the BIG EAST in four statistical categories.

A 2007 Third Team All-Metropolitan selection, Inman is shooting 50.0 percent (54-108) from the field while averaging a team-best 35.4 minutes per contest. He scored a game-high 18 points in 70-64 season-opening win over Tennessee Tech, before posting 21 points and 11 rebounds in 79-67 win over North Dakota State. Inman scored a then career-high 24 points and grabbed nine rebounds in 38 minutes of action in a 73-48 win over North Carolina Central to become the first RU player to post consecutive 20-plus point games since Quincy Douby. At Florida, he played a career-high 39 minutes en route to 17 points and seven rebounds. Versus Dartmouth, he had a game-high 12 rebounds. At St. Peter's, he finished with 11 points and 13 rebounds, the sixth double-double of his career. Against Princeton, he had a team-high 16 points and a team-high tying eight rebounds, and he followed that up with a career-high 26 points against Lafayette. He totaled 12

points against Nebraska, the eighth time he has scored in double-figures this season.

Inman spent this past August in San Francisco performing the rigorous Chameleon Training program. Inman ran in the sand at Baker Beach, dashed up hills with a 60-pound pack on his back, and climbed ropes; all in an effort to improve his strength and agility. He trained for a month in the program with several NBA and college players, including Hilton Armstrong (New Orleans Hornets), Gabe Pruitt (Boston Celtics) and Kareem Rush (Seattle SuperSonics).

Inman has started 57 of 60 career games and ranks 15th all-time at Rutgers with 75 career blocks. He has scored in double figures 41 times in his career. The team's top returning player from last season in terms of field goals, free throws, free throw percentage, rebounding, points and scoring average, he was a *CollegeInsider.com* Freshman All-American and BIG EAST All-Rookie Team selection in 2006.

### CHANDLER BLING

Freshman **Corey Chandler**, a preseason honorable mention freshman All-America selection by *CollegeHoops.net*, opened his Scarlet career in style, scoring 16 points versus Tennessee Tech, the most points scored by an RU rookie in a season opener since Charles Jones scored 19 in a 70-64 win over Manhattan on Nov. 27, 1993. The Newark native followed with 14 points against North Dakota State and 10 points against North Carolina Central. At Florida, he played a season-high 34 minutes en route to 10 points. At St. Peter's, he scored a team-high 16 points. After a 19 point effort against Lafayette, Chandler scored a career-high 25 at Nebraska, the most points scored by a true freshman since Quincy Douby scored 28 in a 76-71 NIT victory over Temple on March 17, 2004. Chandler, who is the first freshman to score in double-figures in his first four games since Earl Johnson accomplished the feat in 1996-97, ranks eighth in the BIG EAST in steals.

Against the Gators, Chandler was joined in double figures by **Mike Coburn**, who also posted 10 points. It marked the first time that a pair of freshmen scored in double digits since **JR Inman** and **Anthony Farmer** each posted 11 as rookies in a 78-68 overtime win at DePaul on January 16, 2006. Coburn's first career start came against Lafayette, and the freshman scored a career-high 15 points in the 90-79 win.

### MAN IN THE MIDDLE

**Hamady Ndiaye**, who leads the BIG EAST and ranks 7th nationally in blocked shots, has blocked four or more shots six times this season. Ndiaye plays an average of 20.4 minutes per game, averaging 5.7 points, 6.1 rebounds, and 3.8 blocks. The other four starters average 29.9 minutes per contest. If Ndiaye played 29.9 minutes per game, he would average 8.3 points, 8.9 rebounds, and 5.5 blocks. If Ndiaye played 40 minutes a contest, he would average 11.1 points, 12.0 rebounds, and 7.4 blocks.

### RE-JOYNING THE TEAM TO BRING SENIOR LEADERSHIP

Fifth-year senior **Byron Joynes** has returned to captain the Scarlet Knights after missing the 2006-07 campaign with a foot injury. The Baltimore native, who is considered one of the top defenders of the post position in the BIG EAST Conference, has persevered through multiple injuries during his tenure "On The Banks." He has competed in 97 career games and ranks 19th all-time at Rutgers with 61 career blocks and 39th in the school books with 440 career rebounds. Joynes, who is the lone senior on the RU roster, has improved his strength, agility and conditioning exponentially since arriving on cam-

pus as a freshman weighing 310 pounds. Joynes, who has 54 career starts to his credit, has come off the bench in the first nine games. He has grabbed 10 or more rebounds 12 times in his career.

### ROOKIE KNIGHTS

Rutgers' four-player 2007 recruiting class arrived in Piscataway with a regional flavor and an abundance of national accolades. Newark native **Corey Chandler** was a Rivals four star recruit rated as the nation's 10th-best point guard and 62nd overall prospect. *Scout.com* graded him as a four star prospect and the 12th-rated point guard nationally. Cited as the 55th overall prospect in the country by *Hoop Scoop* and 77th overall by *The Sporting News/Rise* magazine, Chandler was also the 12th-rated point guard prospect nationally by Scouts, Inc. Mount Vernon (N.Y.) native **Mike Coburn** was a *scout.com* three star prospect rated as the No. 19 point guard in the country. A Rivals three star recruit rated as the 43rd point guard prospect nationally by Scouts, Inc., Coburn was cited by *Hoop Scoop* as the No. 77 overall recruit nationally. Philadelphia native **Earl Pettis** was a *scout.com* three-star prospect cited as the 37th-ranked small forward nationally. A Rivals three star prospect, he was rated as the nation's 21st-best fifth-year player by *Hoop Scoop*. Sharpshooter guard **Justin Sofman** was an All-New England selection as a postgraduate at St. Thomas More School. A West Milford (N.J.) HS grad, he was named one of the top five shooters in the state by *NJHoops.com* as a senior.



### A NEW JERSEY PROGRAM

Rutgers is the State University of New Jersey and the 2007-08 Scarlet Knight roster is loaded with home grown talent from the Garden State. The 13-player roster features 10 student-athletes that played high school or junior college hoops in New Jersey. **Thomas Askew** (Passaic C.C.), **Corey Chandler** (East Side HS), **Anthony Farmer** (St. Augustine's Prep), **Kofi Genfi** (Sayreville War Memorial HS), **Jaron Griffin** (Manchester Township HS), **JR Inman** (St. Joseph's-Montvale HS), **Hamady Ndiaye** (Life Center Academy), **Courtney Nelson** (Bloomfield Tech), **Charlie Rigoglioso** (Wayne Valley HS), **Justin Sofman** (West Milford HS). In addition, eleven players live within an hour's drive from Rutgers, including **Mike Coburn** (Mount Vernon, N.Y.) and **Earl Pettis** (Philadelphia, Pa.).

The coaching also has a distinct N.J. flavor. Head coach **Fred Hill** hails from Verona, N.J. and played point guard at Montclair State. Assistant coach **Craig Carter** is a Rutgers letterwinner, who ranks in the top ten all-time in both assists and steals. **Darren Savino** played prep hoops under Bob Hurley, Sr. at Saint Anthony's before competing at Jersey City State. Director of Basketball Operations **Dennis Gregory** is also a New Jersey native and former high school coach the Garden State.

### LOCAL PRODUCTS WALK-ON

Among the seven newcomers that are listed on the 2007-08 Rutgers roster are three local walk-ons. Paterson, N.J. native **Thomas Askew**, A 2007 NJCAA Academic All-American, arrives after playing two seasons at Passaic C.C. Freshman forward **Kofi Genfi** was a two-time Greater Middlesex County All-White Division selection at Sayreville War Memorial HS. Freshman guard **Charlie Rigoglioso** was a two-time All-Passaic selection by both the *Bergen Record* and *Herald News* at Wayne Valley HS.

### WHAT I DID LAST SUMMER

Forward **Jaron Griffin** was part of a trio of Rutgers men's basketball players that represented the Scarlet Knights overseas this past summer. The junior was a standout performer on the East Coast All-Stars 10-day tour of Holland and Belgium, which featured seven contests in a span of seven days. He averaged 18.9 point per game, including 27 points per game in the final three contests, which produced a pair of East Coast victories. Junior guard **Anthony Farmer** was also a member of the All-Stars, while freshman guard **Mike Coburn** competed on an 11-day tour of China with his Mount Vernon HS squad. Coburn's high school squad split its stay between Beijing and Shanghai, played three exhibition games and visit attractions such as the Great Wall, Tiananmen Square and the Forbidden City. Among the exhibitions were contests against Han Mo, the reigning Shanghai city champions, and a junior national team.

### FORMER RU PLAYERS ABROAD

2006-07 senior Adrian Hill signed a professional contract this summer to play overseas. A forward who ranks ninth all time at Rutgers with a .521 (222-426) career field goal percentage, he inked a deal with Obila De Avila of Spain's LEB2 League. Hill joined a multitude of Scarlet Knights competing professionally overseas. Other former Rutgers cagers utilizing their visas on the hardwood include Jerome Coleman (Brest/France), Jeff Greer (Nancy/France), Robert Hodgson (Thor Thor/Iceland), Herve Lamizana (Shangdong L./China), Joel Salvi (Leagea/Italy), Ricky Shields (TED Koleji/Turkey) and Alvydas Tenys (Pirita/Estonia)

The most notable Scarlet Knight playing professionally is NBA first round draft choice Quincy Douby, who played in 42 games as a rookie with the Sacramento Kings in 2006-07. In addition, 2006-07 senior Marquis Webb was recently drafted by the Anaheim Arsenal of NBA D-League.

### A COMMITMENT TO COMMUNITY

The Rutgers men's basketball program takes a proactive approach to civic responsibility under head coach **Fred Hill**. Among Hill's recent community initiatives was the "Frankie and Freddie's Skills and Drills Day," which ran a free clinic for children via sponsorships while raising funds to renovate the playground at Sea Girt Elementary School. ## HEAD COACH FRED HILL

A "throwback, old-school coach," Fred Hill is in his second season directing Rutgers' men's basketball program. The Verona, N.J. native enters 2007-08 with 26 seasons of Division I coaching experience and eight BIG EAST postseason appearances on his resume.

Born and raised in the Garden State, Hill recognized a life-long dream when he was named head

coach of the Scarlet Knights on March 27, 2006.

"Our program will be built on basic characteristics," said Hill. "We're going to be known for our toughness, our togetherness, our hard work, our passion and our pride in Rutgers University. Players need to be put in the right role. Ideally, with the personnel we bring in, I'd like to get up and down the floor on offense and use multiple defensive looks, but again, it comes down to putting guys in the right position to be successful."

At the core of Hill's coaching and personal philosophy is a commitment to community service. Echoing John Wooden's famous quote that "You can't live a perfect day without doing something for someone who will never be able to repay you," he takes a proactive approach to civic responsibility. Among his recent community initiatives was the "Frankie and Freddie's Skills and Drills Day," which ran a free clinic for children via sponsorships while raising funds to renovate the playground at Sea Girt Elementary School. He is also a strong supporter of the Jimmy V Foundation, founded by ESPN and the late Jim Valvano, who co-captained the 1966-67 Rutgers squad. Proceeds from Hill's annual charity golf tournament benefit the foundation.

Rutgers men's basketball players are active in community outreach under Hill's leadership. Recently, student-athletes visited the High Road School, a special education facility for children with learning disabilities and emotional and social needs. They also interacted with disabled children and young adults at Matheny Medical and Education Center. This past season, the team participated in the nation "Read Across America" program and read to children at local elementary schools. In addition, every player is assigned a pen pal at a local elementary school via "Scarlet Letters," a program sponsored by men's basketball that further enables the Scarlet Knights to serve as positive role models in the surrounding communities.

Hill, 48, was instrumental in the New Jersey Greats of the Game coaches clinic this past October and the New Jersey Legends of Basketball clinic in 2006. The 2007 clinic featured legendary Garden State hardwood mentors Tom Brennan, Patty Coyle, Mike Fratello, Brian Hill and Bob Hurley, Sr. The inaugural event offered insight and instruction from Hubie Brown, Pete Carril, Bob Farrell and Rollie Massimino. Both clinics were hosted in conjuncture with the NJSIAA and NJSCA and were attended by more than 500 coaches.

The Legends clinic was not the only camp to achieve success under Hill. This past summer, Scarlet Knight clinics attracted over 1,000 scholastic players and more than 100 high school teams.

Since taking the helm "On The Banks," Hill has made great strides in improving team resources and operations. A locker room renovation, the hiring of a strength and conditioning specialist exclusively for basketball and streamlined team travel have been achieved during his short tenure. The Scarlet Knights now charter to away contests, enabling players to spend more time in the classroom.

Widely regarded as one of the Eastern basketball's top recruiters, Hill has helped recruit and mentor seven Big East Student-Athletes that have gone on to the NBA careers since 2001. Included in the group is former Rutgers guard and 2006 first round pick Quincy Douby. In addition, three 2007-08 freshmen were cited among the highest-rated recruits at their positions nationally by numerous recruiting services

Prior to being named the program's 16th head coach, Hill served as Associate Head Coach for the Scarlet Knights during the 2005-06 season. In this capacity, he earned his first courtside victory at the helm. He led Rutgers to a 91-84 win over Marquette on Feb. 12, 2006, while serving as acting head coach that afternoon.

Before Rutgers, Hill spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Villanova University, including the final two as associate head coach. He was a major factor in the recruitment of Villanova's highly-acclaimed recruiting classes of 2002 and 2003, and played a key role in on-court teaching and in-game strategy. Villanova reached the Sweet 16 in 2005 and advanced to the Elite Eight in 2006.

Hill served three seasons (1998-2001) as an assistant coach at Seton Hall University, where he was part of the staff that helped secure the Pirates to the Sweet 16 in 2000 and secure the top-ranked recruiting class in the nation that year.

Prior to his stint at Seton Hall, Hill served seven years as an assistant coach at Fairleigh Dickinson University, including his final three seasons as associate head coach. In Hill's final season at FDU, the Knights were 23-7 and captured the NEC title. The team advanced to the NCAA tournament to face No. 2 seed Connecticut. Guard Elijah Allen scored 43 points, the third highest output all-time in the East Region, but the 15th-seeded Knights dropped a hard-fought 93-85 decision to the Huskies.

Hill has also served as an assistant coach at the University of Maine (1988-91), Marquette University (1986-88), Rider College (1983-86) and Lehigh University (1982-83). His first college coaching position was at his alma mater, Montclair State College, in 1981-82.

Hill is a 1977 graduate of Verona High School and a 1981 graduate of Montclair State College. At MSC, he was an All-Conference guard as a senior on a team that reached the NCAA Division III Tournament. He earned a degree in business administration.

**RUTGERS POSTGAME NOTES**

Freshman Corey Chandler scored 16 points, the most points by a rookie in a season opener since Charles Jones scored 19 in a 70-64 win over Manhattan on Nov. 27, 1993.

Rutgers held Tennessee Tech to 33.8 percent from the floor, approximately 10 percentage points better than what it did defensively last season. In 2006-07, the Scarlet Knights defense allowed teams to shoot 43.3 percent from the floor.

Redshirt senior Byron Joynes scored his first basket since the 2005-06 season at the 10:46 mark in the first half. He finished with five points. With 11 rebounds, Joynes jumped two spots from 43rd to 41st place all-time with 396, nine rebounds behind 40th place Eddie Jordan. Joynes' 11 rebound effort marks the 11th time he has had 10 or more rebounds in a game, and the 22nd time he led the team in rebounding.

With 18 points, junior JR Inman picked up his 34th career double-digit scoring game. Inman blocked two shots to give him 70 for his career, seven behind 13th-place Mike Jones.

With two assists, junior Anthony Farmer took sole possession of 23rd-place all-time with 214.

The game marked the 59th career-start for Farmer, the 49th career-start for Inman, the 31st career-start for Griffin and the third career-start for Ndiaye.

Rutgers 1,000-point scorer Don Parsons was in attendance and sat behind the Scarlet Knights' bench. His grandson, Chandler, is a freshman forward for the Gators and scored seven points.

The crowd of 11,522 was the largest to watch the Scarlet Knights since 17,194 witnessed the contest versus Marquette at the Bradley Center last season (2/7/07).

### RUTGERS POSTGAME NOTES

Freshman Corey Chandler finished with 25 points, a career-high. He scored the most points as a true freshman since Quincy Douby scored 28 as a true freshman in a 76-71 NIT victory over Temple on March 17, 2004. Chandler was 10-of-20 from the floor, marking career-highs in field goals and field goal attempts.

Chandler grabbed a career-high six rebounds, including a career-high four offensive boards.

Chandler blocked Steve Harley's shot with 14:39 to go in the second half for his first blocked shot of the season.

Chandler tied his season-high with 34 minutes played. He had accomplished the feat twice, most recently at St. Peter's on Nov. 25, 2007.

Junior JR Inman grabbed four rebounds, giving him 401 for his career. He is now in 42nd place on the Rutgers all-time rebounds list.

Inman tied his season-high with 39 minutes played. He previously accomplished the feat at Florida on Nov. 17, 2007.

Sophomore Hamady Ndiaye blocked five shots to give him 83 for his career, moving him into a tie for 11th place on the Rutgers all-time blocked shot list.

Redshirt senior Byron Joynes grabbed eight rebounds, giving him 440 for his career, three boards away from tying Chuck Weiler for 38th place on the Rutgers all-time rebounding list.
