### The Game

BIG EAST play continues for Rutgers as the Scarlet Knights head south to Florida to face USF in a rare Wednesday night game on Nov. 3. ESPN2 will televise the mid-week contest from Raymond James Stadium in Tampa at 7 p.m.

Chris Fowler (play-by-play), Todd Blackledge (color) and Rob Stone (sideline) are the game announcers for ESPN2.

The Rutgers Radio Network begins pre-game coverage at 6 p.m. as Chris Carlin calls the action with former Rutgers QB Ray Lucas (color analyst) and Anthony Fucilli (sideline). The Rutgers Radio Network includes WOR-710 AM in New York City, WCTC-1450 AM in Central Jersey and 97.5 FM The Fanatic in Philadelphia and South Jersey.

The Rutgers Radio Network feed is available nationally on Sirius Satellite Radio (TBA). In addition, WRSU has complete coverage of the game on 88.7 FM in New Brunswick and the BIG EAST ISP Radio Network has national coverage of the game with John Rooke and Peter Brock on the call.

### Head Coach Greg Schiano

Rutgers head coach **Greg Schiano (Bucknell '88)** is in his 10th season with the Scarlet Knights. Schiano will be just the fourth coach in BIG EAST history to coach 10 seasons at the same school, joining Paul Pasqualoni (Syracuse, 14 years), Frank Beamer (Virginia Tech, 13 years) and Don Nehlen (West Virginia, 10 years). Schiano passed former Boston College head coach Tom O'Brien earlier in the season as the fifth-winningest coach all-time in victories in the BIG EAST (59-58).

Schiano will tie former West Virginia head coach Rich Rodriguez for fourth place in BIG EAST history in coaching victories with one more win.

The 2006 National and BIG EAST Coach of the Year, Schiano has guided Rutgers to a school-record five consecutive bowl appearances, including four straight bowl victories. Rutgers is just one of four schools in the nation to win four consecutive bowl games.

### Rankings

Rutgers and USF are not ranked in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Top 25 polls.

### USF Series

Rutgers has won four straight games vs. USF and leads the all-time series 4-1 against the Bulls. Last season, the Scarlet Knights shutout No. 23/24 USF 31-0 in an ESPN Thursday night primetime contest.

The Scarlet Knights are a perfect 2-0 at Raymond James Stadium. Last time in Tampa, Rutgers rolled to a 49-16 victory in 2008 over the Bulls.

Junior RB **Joe Martinek** has been a force in both of Rutgers' last two victories vs. USF. In 2008, Martinek rushed for 98 yards on 21 carries and two touchdowns in the win. Last season, Martinek carried the ball 25 times for 128 yards and a touchdown.

Rutgers has averaged 169.6 rushing yards per game all-time in the series vs. the Bulls. The Scarlet Knights have rushed for over 100 yards in every game vs. USF, including 160 yards on the ground in last season's win. **Greg Schiano** is 4-1 all-time vs. USF.

### Up Next

Rutgers returns home to Rutgers Stadium for the first time since Oct. 8 to face Syracuse on Saturday, Nov. 13.

### Rutgers Athletic Communications

To assist in your coverage throughout the year, please read the media information on this page. Briefly, all interviews must be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office at least one day in advance and all players, coaches and support staff will not take part in an interview unless scheduled by the Athletic Communications Office.

### Post-Game Interviews

Coach Schiano and players, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available after each game to members of the media. Coach Schiano's press conference will take place in the team meeting room of the Hale Center, which is located opposite the playing field from the press box.

With approximately five minutes remaining in the game, members of the media will be escorted across the field towards the Hale Center.

Rutgers' locker room is open to the media following the cooling off period.

The visiting team's press conference will be held in the field hockey locker room, inside the Hale Center.

### Player Interviews

All player interviews must be arranged through the Athletic Communications Office at least one day in advance. Players are available in person on Mondays at the weekly Rutgers Football Luncheon, and following practice on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, pending class schedules/availability.

Please consult with Jason Baum regarding availability. Player availability at other times will vary from week to week. A time mutually convenient for the player and the member of the media can be set up by the Athletic Communications Office. During a traditional game week, there will be no player interviews after Wednesday until following the game.

### Coach Schiano Interviews

All interview requests must be arranged through Jason Baum. Coach Schiano will be available to the media every Monday on the BIG EAST Coaches Conference call at 11 a.m., Tuesday at his weekly press conference at 1 p.m. in the team meeting room of the Hale Center and after practice on Wednesday and Thursday.

### Covering Practice

Rutgers' preseason practices begin August 5. Throughout the season, practice will be open to the media for the first 30 minutes on Tuesday and Wednesday. Practice is closed to the media on Sunday and Thursday.

### Filming at Practice

On Tuesday and Wednesday, video and photo access is available during individual periods of practice. Tripods are not permitted on the practice field and media members must stand at least five yards off the sideline.

Selected players will be available each Monday at the Rutgers Football Luncheon from 11:15-12 noon in the stadium club of the Hale Center.

## Sunshine State Streak

Rutgers has won four consecutive games in the state of Florida, dating back to the 2006 season. The Scarlet Knights defeated FIU 19-14 in Miami earlier this season along with last season's victory over UCF (45-24) in the St. Petersburg Bowl in St. Petersburg.

Road wins in Tampa at USF in 2008 and 2006 are also included during the three-game winning streak in Florida. The last loss for Rutgers in Florida was Nov. 22, 2003 at No. 14/13 Miami (34-10).

Fifteen Scarlet Knights who hail from Florida return home to face the Bulls.

## Welcome Back to Tampa

Two Tampa natives return home this week when the Scarlet Knights visit USF. Senior DE **Jonathan Freeny** and true freshman WR **Jeremy Deering** have been two key performers this season for Rutgers.

Freeny has started all seven games at defensive end and has 22 tackles, 4.5 TFLs and four quarterback hurries on the season.

Deering has appeared in all seven games, including four starts, at wide receiver in his first season "On the Banks." He leads the team in yards per reception (20.9) and ranks third on the squad in receiving yards (251) and receptions (12). Last year, Deering announced on live local television in Tampa his pledge to Rutgers over Florida State prior to National Signing Day.

## On the NFL Stage

For the third straight game, Rutgers will play in an NFL stadium this week as the Scarlet Knights visit the home of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Wednesday vs. USF.

Rutgers played the first college football game between Football Bowl Subdivision members at the New Meadowlands Stadium on Oct. 16 in a 23-20 overtime victory over Army.

Last week at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh, Rutgers fell 41-21 to the host Panthers.

Since the start of the 2006 season, Rutgers is 6-1 in games played at NFL stadiums.

## Super Bowl Venues

For the 13th time in school history, Rutgers will play a game in a stadium that has hosted the Super Bowl Wednesday at USF.

The Scarlet Knights are 5-6 all-time in Super Bowl venues, including a 2-0 mark at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa.

Darnell Stapleton, a former Rutgers center from 2005-06 and the older brother of current starting LT Desmond Stapleton, started on the offensive line for Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLIII in Tampa as the Steelers defeated the Arizona Cardinals for the championship. Desmond was in the stands to watch his brother win a Super Bowl ring.

## The Comeback Kid

Rutgers true freshman QB **Chas Dodd** has rallied the Scarlet Knights in the fourth quarter for two victories this season. Even more impressive, the two fourth quarter comebacks came in Dodd's first two career starts.

Dodd was 16-of-22 (72.7%) passing for 285 yards and three touchdowns in the victories over UConn and Army in the fourth quarter and overtime. Dodd was 7-of-9 passing for 151 yards and a touchdown vs. UConn in the fourth quarter on Oct. 8 before going 8-of-12 for 128 yards and two scores vs. Army in the fourth quarter and overtime.

## Fourth Quarter Magic

After trailing 17-3 to start the fourth quarter, Rutgers scored 14 points in the final stanza to force overtime and earn the 23-20 OT victory over Army on Oct. 16. The 14-point fourth quarter deficit was the largest Rutgers' has rallied from for a victory since trailing at Vanderbilt 34-16 on Oct. 9, 2004. Rutgers responded with a 37-34 victory at Vandy for the largest fourth quarter comeback in school history.

The Scarlet Knights moved to 2-4 all-time in overtime games with the win vs. Army.

## Game-Winning Field Goal

For the second time under **Greg Schiano**, Rutgers converted a game-winning field goal with less than 30 seconds remaining in the 27-24 victory over UConn.

Junior PK **San San Te** drilled a 34-yard field goal with 13 seconds remaining to secure the three-point victory. He was named the BIG EAST Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 11 for his performance vs. UConn.

The only other game-winning field goal with less than 30 seconds to play came via the right foot of Jeremy Ito in 2006 vs. No. 3 Louisville. Ito booted a 28-yard field goal - with also 13 seconds remaining - to give Rutgers a thrilling 28-25 victory over Louisville.

## A Debut for the Ages

**Chas Dodd** had one of the greatest debuts of any QB in school history with his 322-yard performance in the 27-24 victory over Connecticut on Oct. 8.

Dodd was named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week by the league office and the BIG EAST Player of the Week by Rivals.com following the UConn game.

He completed six passes of 20 yards or longer in the contest. Dodd had career-bests in completions (18), yards (322) and touchdowns (2), while he completed a career-long pass of 52 yards.

Dodd threw for the third-highest yardage total in a single-game by a true freshman QB in school history.

The 322 passing yards for Dodd were the most ever by a quarterback making their first career start in the **Greg Schiano** era. It was the second-most passing yards by a quarterback in his first career start in school history, trailing only Mike McMahon with his 386 yards on 26-for-42 passing at Army in 1997.

It also marked the first 300-yard passing performance since Mike Teel (319 yards) against NC State in the PapaJohns.com Bowl on Dec. 29, 2008.

The 322 yards passing by Dodd were also the most by any player in the BIG EAST in 2010 at the time of the game.

Rutgers junior PK **San San Te** is 15th among active career kickers in the nation with 40 made field goals. The 40 field goals also place Te third in school history in career field goals made. The North Carolina native is 10-for-14 on the season.

### Representing the 305

**Antonio Lowery**, a native of Miami, has been all over the field in 2010. Lowery leads the team in tackles (69) and ranks second in the BIG EAST and tied for 24th nationally with 9.8 tackles per game.

Lowery totaled a career-high 19 tackles in the 23-20 overtime victory over Army. It was the most tackles by a Scarlet Knight during the Greg Schiano era and the most tackles by any player in the BIG EAST this season. The active linebacker has also recovered three fumbles and forced one fumble this season.

### No Ordinary Joe

Joe Lefeged has been a man on a mission in 2010 for the Scarlet Knights. The Germantown, Md., product has been all over the field on defense and special teams this season and was named a Mid-Season All-America by Phil Steele.

Lefeged became the first player in BIG EAST history to be named the Defensive and Special Teams Player of the Week, in the same week, the league office announced Sept. 13. Lefeged earned the two awards after an incredible performance in the victory at FIU.

The senior strong safety blocked two punts, forced two fumbles, recorded one interception, broke up a pass and had six tackles in the win.

It marked the second time in two weeks a Scarlet Knight was named Special Teams Player of the Week after **Brandon Bing** earned the award on Sept. 6.

Lefeged was also named the Jim Thorpe National Defensive Back of the Week for his amazing performance at FIU. The Maryland product is second on the squad with 51 tackles and leads Rutgers with five pass breakups.

### 28-5

Under head coach **Greg Schiano**, Rutgers is 28-5 when rushing for 175 yards or more in a game. Since the start of the 2006 season, the Scarlet Knights are 20-2 when going over the 175-yard mark on the ground in a game.

Rutgers is 1-0 when rushing for more than 175 yards in a game in 2010. The Scarlet Knights totaled 268 rushing yards in the 31-0 victory over Norfolk State.

The Bulls are coming off an impressive 38-30 victory at two-time defending BIG EAST champion Cincinnati last time out, snapping the Bearcats 13-game conference winning streak in the process.

Sophomore QB B.J. Daniels leads the Bulls offense. USF ranks 71st nationally in scoring offense (25.8), 95th in total offense (323.7), 93rd in passing offense (175.4) and 67th in rushing offense (148.3). Daniels leads USF with 1,314 yards of total offense to go along with four touchdowns on the season.

Defensively, the Bulls bring on the nation's most potent pass rushers into the game. USF ranks tied for ninth in the nation with 3.0 sacks per game. Sam Barrington leads USF with 42 tackles and two forced fumbles on the season.

On special teams, USF features the BIG EAST's best kickoff returner in Lindsey Lamar. Lamar ranks sixth nationally with an average kickoff return of 29.8 yards, including a long of 94 yards for a touchdown.

USF ranks among the BIG EAST leaders in sacks (first), punt returns (second, 14.1) and scoring defense (third, 18.6).

A new era began at the University of South Florida with the hiring of Skip Holtz as the head coach of the football program on Jan. 14, 2010.

Holtz, who is just the second head coach in the 13 year history, came to USF after five seasons at East Carolina and back-to-back Conference USA Championships. Holtz is one of just four coaches nationally to lead his teams to league titles each of the last two seasons.

### Series History

Rutgers leads the series 4-1 after last season's 31-0 shutout in Piscataway. The Scarlet Knights are 2-0 all-time in Tampa, including a 49-16 victory in their last visit in 2008. Wednesday's meeting is the first between Greg Schiano and Skip Holtz as head coaches.

**PISCATAWAY, N.J.** - Junior RB Joe Martinek rushed for 109 yards and a score to help Rutgers to a 31-0 win over Norfolk State Thursday before 46,311 fans in the season opener at Rutgers Stadium. The RU defense limited the Spartans to 156 total yards, including just 25 on the ground, in the shutout victory.

In addition to the strong defensive effort, which limited NSU to a 0-for-12 mark on third down conversions, specialty units also shined for the Scarlet Knights. Senior CB Brandon Bing blocked two punts that resulted in scores.

The Scarlet Knights generated 230 yards in the second half, posting 25 points. RU scored on all three of its trips inside the red zone and was a perfect five-for-five for the game.

San San Te split the uprights from 31 yards to produce a 3-0 edge with 7:30 on the first quarter clock.

With less than a minute to play in the second quarter the Scarlet Knights surged. A 28-yard punt return by Mason Robinson preceded Tom Savage passes to Mohamed Sanu of 26 and 29 yards, respectively, during a five-play, 49-yard drive. The second connection to the sophomore brought RU to within three yards of the goal line with just one second on the clock. After an official review, the home squad utilized that lone second to boot a 20-yard field goal to enter the locker room at the midpoint with a 6-0 advantage.

RU's initial touchdown of its young campaign came with 7:55 showing on the third quarter clock. A six-yard Martinek scoring scamper capped a seven play, 75-yard drive. The junior carried four times on the drive for 54 yards. A Sanu rush from the wildcat formation resulted in a successful two-point conversion and Rutgers led 14-0.

The Rutgers special teams, already having a productive evening, quickly increased the advantage. Bing blocked his second punt of the night and senior SS Joe Lefeged scooped the ball up at the NSU three-yard line and entered the end zone to set up a 21-0 advantage.

The next score landed in the hands of Sanu. Savage connected with the receiver on a 10-yard touchdown toss with 8:27 remaining to widen the divide to 28-0. The reception was the culmination of a methodical, 11-play, 70-yard drive.

**MIAMI, Fla.** - Senior DB Joe Lefeged forced three turnovers and blocked a pair of punts, which set up two separate scoring drives, as the Rutgers football team defeated FIU 19-14 at FIU Stadium.

Rutgers moved to 2-0 for the first time since 2007 with the fourth quarter comeback victory over the Golden Panthers.

The Scarlet Knights got on the board first after one of five turnovers on the evening led to three points for Rutgers. Senior LB Antonio Lowery forced a fumble by FIU's Wes Carroll, which was recovered by senior DE Jonathan Freeny on the 31-yard line. RU moved into field goal range with junior PK San San Te connecting on a 43-yard field goal give Rutgers a 3-0 edge.

Rutgers closed out the first half with five turnovers (three fumbles and two interceptions) to keep the contest close. In addition to Freeny's fumble recovery, senior DB Brandon Bing intercepted the first pass of the game and Lefeged forced a fumble that was recovered by sophomore LB Steve Beauharnais in the first quarter. Carroll hooked up with Wayne Times for a 28-yard TD score in the first quarter to give the Golden Panthers a 7-3 advantage.

Lefeged was involved in three first half turnovers as he forced a fumble in the second quarter which was picked up by Lowery and the safety also intercepted a pass that led to a Rutgers touchdown four plays later. Following Lefeged's interception, sophomore WR Mohamed Sanu carried RU 32 yards and capped the drive with a 24-yard touchdown pass to sophomore TE D.C. Jefferson on fourth down as RU reclaimed the lead at 10-7.

Sanu ended the game with 44 yards on nine carries and a touchdown to go along with his passing score.

The Scarlet Knights also blocked a second quarter FIU punt, which led to another Te field goal from 42 yards to make it 13-7 at the halftime break. Lefeged broke free through the line to block his first kick of the game and RU followed with a five-play drive that was capped with Te's field goal.

Carroll threw for a second touchdown pass in the third quarter as the Golden Panthers reclaimed the lead at 14-13 with an 18-yard TD reception.

Lefeged recorded his second blocked punt of the game to help the Scarlet Knights to their next touchdown. The special teams play set up RU's drive on the 24-yard line. Sanu proceeded to carry Rutgers all the way to the end zone on the very next play, pushing the lead to five points at 19-14 with his 24-yard TD run.

Rutgers closed out the game forcing the Golden Panthers into five punts, a missed field goal and turnover on downs to secure the 19-14 win.

**PISCATAWAY, N.J.** – Rutgers put forth a strong effort Saturday afternoon, forcing three turnovers and limiting North Carolina to 91 yards rushing, but it was not enough as the Scarlet Knights fell 17-13 to the Tar Heels at Rutgers Stadium. Sophomore Mohamed Sanu sparked the offense with 115 all-purpose yards, including 74 receiving, and a touchdown.

52,038 fans, the third largest crowd in school history, saw Rutgers establish a 35:39 to 24:21 advantage in time of possession in a game that was not decided until the final minutes.

Rutgers moved 54 yard on 11 plays with that possession. Aided by a 37-yard Tom Savage connection to freshman Jordan Thomas, the Scarlet Knights moved to the UNC 10-yard line. San San Te split the uprights from 32 yards-out to provide RU a 3-0 lead with 5:09 showing on the first quarter clock.

The Rutgers defense exerted the effort on UNC's second possession and Lowery was primary in the result once again. He returned a fumble by Tar Heels tight end Ryan Taylor 20 yards, to set the Scarlet Knights up with a first-and-10 at the visitor 20-yard line. Four plays later, Sanu entered the end zone from 10 yards out via the wildcat formation. The scoring scamper produced a 10-0 advantage with 1:58 remaining in the opening stanza.

North Carolina posted its first points via a one-yard run by White. The touchdown and ensuing extra point reduced RU's lead to 10-7 with 9:19 left in the half.

UNC took its first lead of the contest at the midpoint of the third stanza. A five yard touchdown aerial from T.J. Yates to Taylor capped a 14-play, 80-yard drive to give the Tar Heels a 14-10 advantage.

The Scarlet Knights responded on its subsequent possession. Lefeged provided RU advantageous field position courtesy of a 46-yard kickoff return, which was aided by a 15-yard personal foul penalty. Seven plays later, Te was accurate from 39 yards to bring Rutgers within one, 14-13, with 1:58 left in the third.

The deficit increased to four points courtesy of a North Carolina field goal. After a blocked punt gave the Tar Heels a first-and-10 at the RU 35-yard line, Casey Barth booted a 25-yarder to produce a 17-13 score.

After a late Scarlet Knights' drive into UNC territory came up empty, the Rutgers defense responded with another strong stop. After a three-and-out, the Tar Heels were forced to punt, resulting in a Rutgers first-and-10 at the visitor 34-yard line with 2:21 on the clock. Unfortunately for the Scarlet faithful, the offense was unable gain ground.

The Scarlet Knights had the advantage in total yards and time of possession in a contest which saw Tulane reap the benefits of positive field position.

Senior LB Antonio Lowery had 13 total tackles and 1.5 tackles-for-loss to pace a Rutgers defense that limited Tulane to just 37 rushing yards and a 3-of-13 mark on third down conversions.

Rutgers wasted little time posting the game's first points. On the second play from scrimmage deep in RU territory, Sanu faked a handoff out of the wildcat formation and proceeded to race through the middle of the Green Wave defense. With defenders in chase, the playmaker dove into the end zone from two yards-out to cap the school-record long 91-yard scoring scamper in dramatic fashion. It marked the longest rush in school history.

Sanu's record-breaking rush was the only score of the opening stanza. He would finish the day rushing for 121 yards on nine carries for a 13.4 average on the ground.

Tulane got on the scoreboard via a 39-yard field with 14:19 left in the second.

The Green Wave took its first lead of the afternoon shortly afterwards via advantageous field position once again. A two-yard Jason Peyton touchdown carry capped a five play, 33-yard drive and provided the visitors a 10-7 edge.

Tulane increased its lead to 10 points on its second series of the second half. Playing on a short field after gaining possession on the RU 43-yard line, the Green Wave entered the end zone on four plays. Quarterback Joe Kemp was on the receiving end of a halfback pass from slot receiver D.J. Banks and Tulane led 17-7 with 9:28 remaining in the third quarter.

Facing a double-digit deficit at home for the first time this season, Rutgers responded in definitive fashion. With freshman signal-caller Chas Dodd under center, the Scarlet Knights engineered a 12-play, 55-yard drive to hit pay dirt. Faced with a fourth-and-six, Dodd connected with fellow rookie Jeremy Deering on a first down pass to extend the series, which culminated in another highlight play from Sanu. Dodd and Sanu hooked up on a 10-yard touchdown pass, as the multi-talented wideout dismissed yet another tackler before crossing the plane. Rutgers trailed 17-14 with the third quarter clock winding to a close.

Unfortunately for the 47,963 in attendance, the fourth quarter was scoreless. Rutgers had ventures into Tulane territory late in the contest that stalled.

**PISCATAWAY, N.J.** – Senior placekicker San Te split the uprights from 34 yards-out with 13 seconds remaining to propel Rutgers to a 27-24 win over Connecticut Friday evening at Rutgers Stadium in the BIG EAST opener for both schools. Te was placed in the position to boot the game winner by true freshman signal-caller Chas Dodd, who completed 18-of-29 passes for 322 yards and two touchdowns in his first collegiate start.

Dodd was aided by a pair of young receivers in sophomore Mark Harrison and true freshman Jeremy Deering. Harrison had five catches for 112 yards and a touchdown with a long of 52 yards, while Deering had three receptions for 102 yards and a score with a long of 46 yards. Freshman running back Jordan Thomas also chipped-in with three grabs for 73 yards, including a long of 43.

Faced with a third-and-14 at the UConn 46-yard line, a pair of Rutgers rookies hooked-up to begin a flurry of scoring activity. Dodd connected with Deering on the 46-yard scoring strike to enable a 7-0 RU lead with 8:49 showing on the first quarter clock. It marked the first career touchdown for Deering.

Connecticut answered the score in immediate fashion. Nick Williams returned the ensuing kickoff the length of the field to knot the score at 7-7.

Not to be out-done, Rutgers safety and specialist Joe Lefeged saw fit to return the following UConn kickoff 75 yards to the visitor 14-yard line. Three plays later, Mohamed Sanu crossed the plane on a two-yard run to provide the Scarlet Knights a 14-7 advantage with 6:05 remaining in the initial stanza.

Te split the uprights from 28 yards-out and the home squad led 17-7 with 9:43 remaining before halftime.

The Huskies drew to within a field goal courtesy of Jordan Todman. The junior tailback raced 66 yards into the end zone to reduce the RU advantage to 17-14.

Connecticut took its first lead of the contest on its next possession when Endres connected with Kashif Moore on a 22-yard touchdown pass.

The Rutgers defense, faced with a UConn first-and-goal at the one yard line, held strong and forced a field goal attempt. Dave Teggart booted the 17-yarder to make it 24-17.

After forcing a three-and-out on the Huskies next possession, the RU was finally able to get over the hump. It took only one play to do so. Dodd connected with Harrison on a 52-yard scoring strike and, after Te converted the extra point, the score was tied at 24 with just 3:53 to play.

The Rutgers defense forced three-and-outs on UConn's last three drives before the dramatic finish. A 45-yard Dodd pass to Deering brought Rutgers inside the red zone with just over a minute to play. Four plays later, the kick from Te was good before the raucous crowd of 48,431 fans.

**EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J.** – Junior running back Joe Martinek entered the end zone on a one-yard carry in the first overtime to provide Rutgers with a come-from-behind 23-20 victory over Army Saturday afternoon at the New Meadowlands Stadium. The Scarlet Knights scored 14 fourth quarter points to send the game into extra time and set the stage for the dramatic win.

True freshman signal-caller Chas Dodd engineered 77 and 93-yard drives that culminated in fourth quarter touchdowns en route to 251 passing yards.

Army benefitted from favorable field position to post the afternoon's first points. After blocking a punt, the Black Knights had a first-and-10 at the RU 12-yard line. Three plays later, quarterback Trent Steelman crossed the plane on a three-yard keeper to provide the visitors a 7-0 lead with 2:45 remaining in the opening quarter.

The Scarlet Knights trimmed the deficit at the 10:46 mark of the second stanza. Junior San Te split the uprights from 19 yards out to cap a 13-play, 60-yard drive and RU trailed 7-3. The series was highlighted by a 20-yard pass from Dodd to Deering that brought Rutgers inside the red zone.

The Black Knights extended their advantage to double digits on their ensuing possession. A 50-yard rush gave Army a first-and goal at the seven yard line. Full-back Jared Hassin then carried-in from the three-yard line to provide the visitors a 14-3 lead.

Army added a 21-yard field goal as time expired to take a 17-3 advantage into the half.

After a scoreless third quarter, Rutgers entered the end zone on the first play of the final stanza. Faced with a fourth-and-two at the Army three-yard line, RU decided to go for it. Dodd found RB Kordell Young on a quick aerial just inside the left pylon to culminate a 15-play, 77-yard drive. Te converted the extra point and RU trailed 17-10 with 14:57 remaining. The Scarlet Knights forced an Army punt and the home squad assumed possession at its own seven-yard line with 9:18 remaining in the game. With 93 yards ahead of them, Dodd engineered an eight play drive to pay dirt that consumed 4:02 off the clock. A 53-yard Dodd pass to Jefferson got RU into Army territory. The Black Knights were then flagged for a personal foul, moving Rutgers 68 yards in two plays. Once inside the red zone, the Scarlet Knight would not be denied. Dodd found Harrison in the end zone on a 16-yard strike and the score was tied, 17-17, with 5:16 remaining in regulation.

The Scarlet Knights won the coin toss and deferred, electing to go on defense. Army moved the initial series of overtime to the seven yard line before kicking a 26-yard field goal.

Rutgers assumed possession and immediately gained 12 yards off the legs of Sanu. Five plays later, Martinek plunged over the plane to close out the second come-from-behind win in as many games for the Scarlet Knights.

**PITTSBURGH, Pa.** – A second-half surge proved to be the difference maker as Rutgers fell to Pittsburgh 41-21 at Heinz Field.

The Rutgers defense turned what could have been a potential scoring opportunity for Pittsburgh into seven points for the Scarlet Knights early. On the game's opening drive, the Panthers returned a kickoff 40 yards, connected on a 22 yard pass and followed with a 22 yard carry by Dion Lewis. However, the drive stalled just shy of the red zone as senior defensive tackle Charlie Noonan recorded his first career interception on a Tino Sunseri screen pass. Noonan returned to pass 25 yards to set up the Scarlet Knights' first drive of the game.

RU then marched 49 yards on eight plays, capping its scoring drive with a 1-yard touchdown run by junior running back Joe Martinek.

Pitt found the end zone on its next drive, going 66 yards in 10 plays as Sunseri connected on a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Mike Cruz to tie the game at 7-7.

The Panthers pulled out to a 14-7 lead in the second quarter following a two-play scoring drive. Sunseri completed a pass to wide receiver Jon Baldwin for 46 yards and running back Ray Graham took it the rest of the way with a 13-yard touchdown run.

The Scarlet Knights closed the gap and knotted the game at 14-14 with the special teams unit providing RU's second touchdown. Senior safety Joe Lefeged recorded a 10-yard sack on third down, forcing Pittsburgh to punt. Sophomore defensive back Wayne Warren blocked Dan Hutchins' punt, which went into the end zone and was recovered by senior defensive back Brandon Bing.

The punt block was fifth of the season (second resulting in a touchdown) and marked the 44th defensive/special teams touchdown in head coach Greg Schiano's 10-year Rutgers tenure.

Pittsburgh broke the deadlock following halftime on a six-play, 43-yard scoring drive as Sunseri and Cruz hooked up for their second touchdown of the game – this time, an 11-yard reception.

The Panthers went on to score 27 points over the final two quarters en route to the 41-21 victory. Sophomore quarterback Tom Savage entered the game in the fourth quarter and connected on a 27-yard touchdown pass to sophomore wide receiver Mark Harrison – his third TD reception in as many games.
